Principal Message

Hello and welcome to Week 5 Wallsend Learning Community. It has been great to get through a whole week having all students K-6 back in face-to-face teaching and learning. Our classes hit the ground running as we pivot back into the classrooms. Learning continues to be focused on our key learning areas. However, more focus was placed on wellbeing after such an extended period of time away from school.

This included our new whole school project on **Bucket Filling.** Bucket Filling is a concept and analogy for spreading kindness. When people are kind to others, the idea is that you are filling one's bucket. This can also fill your own bucket as it feels nice to do things for others. The opposite of Bucket Filling is Bucket Dipping. This terminology will be used K-6 to have a more consistent approach to the language we use when discussing kindness and bullying type behaviours. Discussing this at home will support this process further. Please feel free to ask about it with classroom teachers or executive if you would like to know more.

Semester 2 reports will again look a little different this Term due to the large disruption to at school learning. These reports will look similar to Semester 1 2020 when we also spent a large portion of the time in lockdown and home learning. The reports will give a brief overview of your child's progress in English and Mathematics, as well as a general comment on their schooling. I am sure, we are all aware of the complexities of reporting during this time so please feel free to call and talk with your child's classroom teacher if you have any specific questions about their learning.

We need your support in returning devices that were borrowed over the lockdown period. There are just some outstanding returns and these devices are required back in the classroom for use in learning and assessments coming up shortly. Please return as soon as possible to our front office.

WHAT IS IT?	PRACTICAL TECHNIQUES:
Learning Intentions are descriptions of what learners should know, understand and be able to do by the end of a learning period or unit. Learning intentions are the basis for tracking student progress, providing feedback and assessing achievement. In addition to learning intentions, students may also have individual learning goals that they address in their learning.	 Rubrics are guidelines for measuring achievement that state the learning intentions with clear performance criteria, a rating scale and a checklist. Ideally, they are relevant to multiple tasks over a unit of learning. What A Good One Looks Like (WAGOLL) is a collection of work samples, usually on a wall inside the classroom, where teachers share exemplary work. Students are encouraged to refer to the WAGOLL while assessing their own or their peers' work. Work samples can be provided to students at different levels of quality to prompt a discussion on
Success criteria are the measures used to determine whether, and how well, learners have met the learning intentions.	 A bump it up wall involves teachers sharing annotated work. A bump it up wall involves teachers sharing annotated work samples at different levels of quality on the wall in the classroom. The work samples are often rated against rubrics and annotated. Students are asked to review their work against the samples to self-assess their performance and to determine how they might improve the quality of their work before sharing it with the teacher. Student-designed assessment involves students designing test items for a topic they have learn with the correct answers. This offers an opportunity for students to clarify, share and understand learning intentions, and provides feedback to teachers on students 'understanding.
WHY LEARNING INTENTIONS AND SUCCESS CRITERIA?	THINGS TO CONSIDER:
 Ensure all students know what they are going to learn and where they are heading. Provide guidance to teachers on what their chosen teaching and learning activities are seeking to achieve. Provide the basis for feedback and reduce discrepancies between current student understanding and intended learning. Assist students and teachers in tracking and assessing student progress. 	 To avoid simplistic and rigid implementation of learning intentions, it is important to ensure that they are referenced throughout the lesson and not shared only at the beginning of lessons. In lessons where students are expected to come up with different answers and apply different strategies, it might be more valuable <i>not</i> to share learning intentions as there can be a range of equally acceptable goals, rather than a single goal for the whole class.
