


"Well, now we have a variety of items to help you navigate, Nuppie, where are we off to next?" Captain Yet asked.



Recycled Materials Sculptures

Equipment.

- · A variety of recycled materials (boxes, milk cartons, plastic bottles, newspaper, lids, paper, cans etc)
- · A4 paper
- Pencil
- · White craft glue or hot glue gun
- Scissors
- · Masking tape
- · Felt tip pens, crayons or paint for decorating
- Sculpting materials (rubber bands, metal wire, string, skewers, pipe cleaners etc.)



Safety Tips:

Please get adult assistance when using the hot glue gun as it can reach high temperatures and cause burns.

Take care when cutting your materials and using the sculpting materials, as they may have sharp edges.

Method:

- 1. Complete a design drawing of your sculpture. Think about the materials you will need for different components of your sculpture.
- 2. Collect your materials and begin shaping the foundation for your sculpture using the sculpting materials. Use the craft glue, hot glue gun or masking tape to secure these materials together.
- 3. Add the remaining materials needed to complete your sculpture. Ensure that each item is firmly secured using the craft glue, hot glue gun or masking tape.
- 4. While your sculpture is drying, decide on a name for your design. Create a short blurb to explain your choice of design and how your design will teach others about the importance of recycling materials in looking after our environment.

Sundial Experiment

You Will Need:

- paper or polystyrene plates
- · sharp pencil
- marker
- clock
- · a sunny and not too windy day
- ruler
- · adhesive putty, modeling clay or sticky tape

Method:

- 1. Find a spot outdoors that is not sheltered and where the sun is shining brightly.
- 2. Find the center of your plate and push the sharp end of the pencil into it so that it stands upright.
- 3. Secure the pencil in place with some adhesive putty, modeling clay or sticky tape.
- 4. Place the plate outside in your selected spot and on each hour look at where the shadow of your pencil falls.
- 5. With your marker, draw the shadow of the pencil and write the number of the hour.
- 6. Repeat until the end of the school day.
- 7. The next day test out your sundial and make sure the shadows fall on the correct time.



All about Thunderstorms

A thunderstorm is a storm with thunder and lightning. There is often heavy rain during a thunderstorm. Thunderstorms are electrical storms that usually happen in the spring and summer months. They can occur singularly, in clusters, or in lines.

Thunderstorms happen when warm, moist air quickly moves upwards. This causes clouds to form and creates gusty winds, heavy rain and sometimes hail. During a thunderstorm, there is usually very heavy rain. This can last for a few minutes, or for much longer.

The loud sound that thunder makes is caused by the heat of the lightning that happens before you hear the thunder. Sometimes the sound of thunder can last for several seconds. This is because the thunder echoes around the ground, mountains, hills and buildings.

Some of the worst thunderstorms happen when a single thunderstorm stays in one area for a long time.
